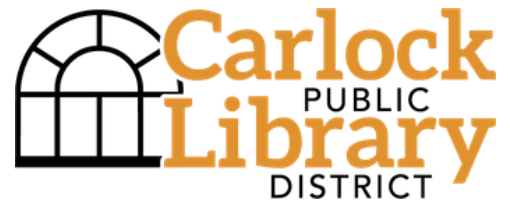

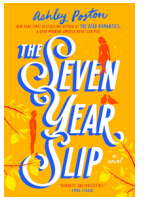
Learn about history through American Girl books and dolls! Just in time for America's 250th birthday, we'll be talking about Felicity and the American Revolution!

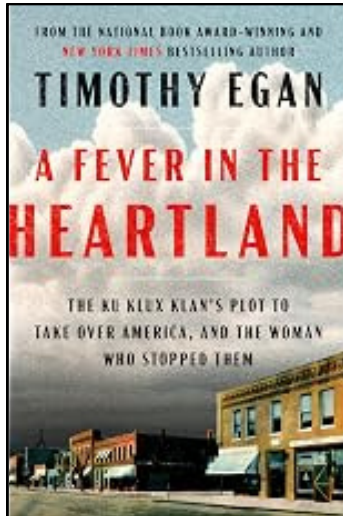

This non-fiction book is an historical thriller about the Klan's rise to power in the 1920s and the charismatic charlatan—D. C. Stephenson, grand dragon of the Indiana clan—who became one of the most powerful people in 1920s America.

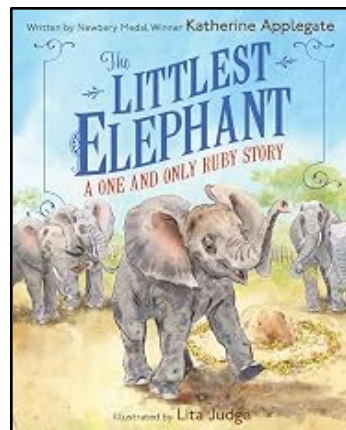
Junior Fiction
