
## **UPCOMING EVENTS**

#### Thursday, Mar. 13 ~ 4:30-5:30 pm






## The Only One Left by Riley Sager

In this suspenseful mystery/ thriller novel, Kit McDeere takes a job as a caregiver to Lenora Hope, a mute, elderly woman accused of murdering her entire family decades earlier. As Kit attempts to unravel the truth behind Lenora's past and the secrets of the mansion, she realizes that nothing is as it seems and she must be careful who she trusts. With one plot twist after another, this book will keep you on the edge of your seat!



This realistic fiction book is about a girl named Melody Brooks who has cerebral palsy and cannot walk or talk. The story is told from Melody's point of view, so readers quickly find out that she is brilliant. Without being able to speak, she must navigate living in a world that often underestimates her true abilities. As Melody works to prove herself to her classmates and show them how smart she is, she learns about friendship, perseverance, and the power of self-expression.







### Junior Fiction
